

2019 NCAPD Oral Health Service Award Presented to Bill Vann



William "Bill" F. Vann, Jr. (1976) of Chapel Hill, NC, was recognized as the 2019 NCAPD Oral Health Service Award recipient at the NCAPD-UNC Division of Pediatric and Public Health reception on Friday, October 11, 2019, in the Rizzo Center. This award "recognizes individuals for outstanding achievements in pediatric oral health in North Carolina, including those who have demonstrated exceptionally strong records of advocacy for children's oral health in the state". A native of Alabama, Bill is a two-time alumnus of UNC-CH. He graduated from college at Auburn University and followed by his DMD from the University of Alabama. He matriculated to the UNC Adams School of Dentistry and earned his MS and PhD from UNC-CH. He has spent more than 40 years as a dental academician at the UNC Adams School of

Dentistry, and continues to teach there part-time. Among many leadership roles, Bill has served as President and Secretary-Treasurer for the North Carolina Academy of Pediatric Dentistry, President of the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry Foundation. He continues to serve in a group called the "Gang of Eight" who meet regularly with the state Department of Health and Human Services Medicaid leadership to advocate for expanding dental Medicaid to cover more children, to increase fees to providers and to keep dentistry carved out of the Medicaid managed care program to encourage greater participation in the NC Medicaid dental program. Bill's thoughtful and creative approaches, along with his leadership experience, advocating for children has been very effective. His passionate advocacy efforts has shown tireless energy and his nomination and selection as the 2019 NCAPD Oral Health Service Award recipient is richly deserved.





2019 Was a Banner Year for New Fellowships!

The Division was blessed with our best year ever in the acquisition of new \$100,000 University-Named Fellowships commitments. Three new fellowships were established, all to be fully funded by 2025. All endowment proceeds from the three will support stipend supplements for residents in pediatric dentistry.

We are progressing nicely toward our 2025 goal to elevate our residents' stipends to those of peer program in the specialty but we have more work to do. Thanks for your help!

Kayla Kopczynski receives the Amy Susan Brooks Travel Award in Pediatric Dentistry

Departmental faculty have a long history of mentoring and collaborating with dental student investigators. Examples of dental student research areas include basic/applied biomaterials, growth and development, dental trauma prevention/treatment, pediatric health services, mineralized tissues, dental education, prenatal/infant oral health, fluoride therapies, fluorosis, breast-feeding, genetics, oral epidemiology, eating disorders, conscious sedation and general anesthesia. In addition to generating scores of peerreviewed publications, our student-faculty collaborations have supported the development of new clinical guidelines, treatment protocols, programmatic innovations, and oral health policy.

Dental student investigators have presented their research findings at local, national and international fora, culminating in numerous and highly competitive awards. They have been invited to present at ADA Annual Meetings in the ADA/Dentsply Student Clinician Research Program, the Hinman Student Research Symposium, and the AADR/IADR Caulk Dentsply Competition. Many of these collaborations have assisted student researchers in earning *Graduation with Distinction Awards* honors.

In the past, dental students have supported their faculty-mentored research with fellowship awards from the now defunct UNC Pfeiffer Research Program, as well as with Adams School of Dentistry and DDS Short-term Research Fellowships. Increasingly, student research interest in children's oral health has outpaced available funding options. For this reason, the Department developed and launched a fund in the Dental Foundation of North Carolina (DFNC) to support future DDS research in children's oral health. Many of our previous dental student investigators are supporting this fund. Thank you! Thank you!

The award, first given in 2018 (received by Abby Becherer and named to honor former DDS researcher and fund benefactor Jon J. Wendell), is aimed to support a grant to underwrite travel expenses for a department-mentored dental student investigator to present their research at a national meeting. Last year, Megan Inclan won the Trevor Jensen Award. To honor a former DDS researcher and fund benefactor, the 2020 recipient will be the **Amy Susan Brooks Travel Award Recipient in Pediatric Dentistry.**

A native of Kentucky, Amy Susan Brooks (DDS, PhD, MD) came to dental school at UNC after completing her college studies at LSU and a master's degree from the University of Colorado. After graduating from dental school at UNC in 1990, she completed medical school, a PhD program, and a residency in oral an oral and maxillofacial surgery (OMFS) at LSU Medical Center in New Orleans. Today she is a Board Certified in OMFS practicing in Morganton, NC, where she resides with her teenage daughter, Emma.

Amy was a two-time Adams School of Dentistry Research Fellow who presented her research findings at two AADR/AADR Meetings. She was mentored by **Bill Vann (1976)** in 1987-88 and Bill and **Henry Fields** in 1988-90.

The 2020 Travel Award Recipient in Pediatric Dentistry is **Kayla Kopczynski** (DDS Class of 2021). Kayla's mentor is **Beau Meyer (2017)** and her research topic is "Oral health-related quality of life in children treated with silver diamine fluoride". She will present the results of her research at the upcoming UNC Adams School of Dentistry Research Day and the IADR/AADR/CADR meeting in Washington, DC in March. Kayla has been collecting primary data on children's oral health-related quality of life from a private pediatric dentistry practice in Charlotte, comparing three groups: 1) conventional, in-office treatment, 2) hospital OR treatment, and 3) SDF treatment. Ultimately, her research will provide quantitative information on

children's and families experience with the use of various restorative and non-surgical caries management techniques that are most relevant in the practice of pediatric dentistry. Congratulations to Kayla and Dr. Meyer!

Resident Recruitment-Interview Weekend 2019

Our program once again had a very successful recruitment cycle. In the spirit of past decades our annual recruitment weekend was the only formal interview process. Miguel will be working on the "Derivation and Description of Clinical Subtypes of Early Childhood Caries" with Jeannie Ginnis (chair), Kimon Divaris, Bill Vann, and Ferreira Zandona (Professor and Chair. Comprehensive Care, Tufts School of Dental Medicine).
