Tim's term will commence at the conclusion of the 46th AADR Annual Meeting in San Francisco, Calif., March 22-25, 2017. After serving the one year

term as vice president, Tim will remain on the AADR Board of Directors for three consecutive terms as president-elect, president and immediate past president. Tim has provided exemplary service to the AADR during his 36 years of continuous membership in the IADR/AADR. We all know Tim as immediate past chair of the Department of Pediatric Dentistry, the James Bawden Distinguished Professor and Director of Strategic Initiatives at the University of North Carolina School of Dentistry. Tim's service to pediatric dentistry and to the AADR is extensive. Tim has served as the Chair of the Council for

Scientific Affairs for both the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry and the American Dental Association. Regarding the latter Tim has contributed to efforts to assist practitioners with decision-making about the use of topical-fluoride caries preventive agents to prevent caries. Did you know that Tim is an internationally recognized clinician/scientist in the areas of amylogenesis, enamel defects and children's' oral health? Tim has had research funding from the NIH and other organizations for his research program focusing on mineralized tissues and developmental defects of teeth and bone. He has received numerous awards and honors including an American Dental Association Teacher Training Fellowship, the William J Gies Award from the Journal of Dental Research, selected as the first Robert Gorlin Visiting Professor at the University of Minnesota School of Dentistry, elected a Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science and in 2016 Tim was inducted into the inaugural class of AADR Fellows, which is a program designed to recognize leaders of AADR and individuals who have served AADR in various ways throughout their careers. Again we congratulate Tim for his continued service to the AADR!

The Chen Excellence in Pediatric Dentistry Lecture Series

Our most recent lecturer, **Sonny Long (1978)**, is well known to us all as both a UNC faculty member and practitioner in Charlotte NC. Dilley**, a long-time faculty member and beloved friend/mentor to residents since her arrival from Indiana in the early 70s. One of her passions was the American Board of Pediatric Dentistry (ABPD), and it's College of Diplomates, for whom she served as a leader for many years. To call attention to and honor this service, the department relies on the Dilley Fund to underwrite the expenses of the senior residents to attend the ABPD Comprehensive Review Course in preparation for

the ABPD's Qualifying Exam. The Board Review Course comes at a time in the life cycle of residents when their personal resources are not plentiful, so the Dilley Fund's sponsorship is a timely source of support. The 2016 Dilley Fellows were: Jenna Alvey (DDS 2011, MS 2016), Erica Brecher (2016), Jackie Burgette (2016), and Scott Swartz (2016). They attended the Comp-Review Course in Atlanta in 2016. The Michael W. Roberts Fellowship Announced



During the Alumni reception on *October 7th, 2016*, we proudly announced our next University Fellowship Name. He needs no introduction. We all know and love him. **Mike Roberts** is a much beloved and highly respected full-time faculty member who taught for decades.

After serving for five years as Graduate Program Director, he served as Department Chair for 10 years. A Professor in both Pediatric Dentistry and Pediatrics, Mike's tenure at UNC is most notable for his role as Chief, Division of Pediatric Dentistry in the UNC Hospitals for the past 27 years. During this timespan, through his indefatigable energy, tireless advocacy for children, and winning personality, he has been almost single-handedly responsible for unimaginable growth experienced in the department's hospital dentistry training program. Currently providing care in the operating room for over 400 children annually, many with special health care needs, this program is one of the Department's precious gems. Under his leadership and mentorship, over 50 pediatric dentists have trained to provide care in a hospital environment. Many of us think of him every time we walk into an operating room to treat a child in need.

Currently, Mike serves as the Henson Distinguished

Professor of Pediatric Dentistry, and over the course of his career, it would be difficult to find a more unselfish and responsible institutional citizen. He has served on over 50 UNC committees, many of them high-level assignments, and most notably on the DDS Admissions Committee for the past 15 years. His service contributions to the institution have been recognized by the 2014 John C. Brauer Award, given by the UNC Dental Alumni Association Board of Directors.

Mike has also been a high-profile leader outside of the University. He served as a Director of the American Board of Pediatric Dentistry (ABPD) from 1993-2000 and as ABPD President in 1999-2000. He was also active in the College of Diplomates of the ABPD, serving as President in 2006-07.

To honor his legacy to the University, DDS alumni, departmental alumni, and friends have established the **Michael W. Roberts Fellowship Fund,** which will be a University-named, permanent endowment fund in the Dental Foundation of North Carolina. Those wishing to make donations to the Michael W. Vann Endowment Fund Exceeds Fundraising Target Ahead of Schedule

At an October reception sponsored by the North Carolina Academy of Pediatric Dentistry (NCAPD) and the school's Department of Pediatric Dentistry, alumni and friends gathered to celebrate the culmination of the Vann Endowment Fund (VEF). The fund honors William F. (Bill) Vann, Jr., (1976) a 42-year member of the department.

After a silent launch in 2011, the VEF campaign went public in May 2012 with a five-year goal to raise \$500,000. To date, the VEF has received more than

\$677,000 in cash and commitments, meaning the fund has not only met but exceeded its goal a year early. The VEF initiative was led by Michael Hasty, (DDS 1986, MS 1989), and Michael Ignelzi, (DDS 1987, PhD 1992), who were assisted by a steering committee.

VEF proceeds have supported an annual departmental alumni/NCAPD reception and a Residents Appreciation Banquet, but will primarily support stipend enhancements for pediatric residents, especially those undertaking long-term training. He has been an advocate for recruiting residents for dualspecialty and doctoral training, and for fellowship experiences in research and teaching. VEF endowment proceeds already support two Vann Fellowships.

Vann arrived at UNC as a Morehead Fellow in 1974 and subsequently earned his MS

and PhD. He has served as DDS program director (1978-85), Chair of Pediatric Dentistry (1985-1994), Pediatric Dentistry Graduate Program director (1995-2006), and principal investigator and Director of a Maternal and Child Health Center for Excellence in Pediatric Dentistry (1992-

2007). He also practiced in the Dental Faculty Practice for 32 years. Vann has published 113 peer-reviewed papers, in addition to 110 abstracts/book chapters, and continues to contribute to peer-reviewed literature.

Vann is no stranger to accolades. He was named Demeritt Distinguished Professor in 1998, a position he held until his retirement from in 2010. He also received a 1999 UNC Distinguished Teaching Award and was consequently named to the UNC Academy of Distinguished Teaching Scholars; the 1999 American Academy of Pediatric Den-

tists (AAPD) Dentist of the Year; the 2012 UNCDAA John Brauer Award, which recognizes a lifetime of service and achievement to the school; and the 2013 ADA Golden Apple Award for Inspiring Dental Careers in Education; among other honors.

He is a known leader in organized dentistry, serving the ADA for a decade in a variety of committee assignments relative to specialty accreditation process, and also as a member of the Commission on Dental Accreditation 1992-95. Similarly, with the AAPD he served seven years on the Board of Trustees, culminating in his appointment as president (1991-92), and also as the AAPD Foundation president 1993-96 and 1999-2001.

Since his retirement in 2010, Vann has remained active in departmental activities. Currently he serves as an attending faculty member once a week in the graduate clinic and

mentors residents on their research. During his free time, he enjoys hiking, running, and spending time and traveling with the loves of his life: his partner, Jessica, and his daughter, Rachel, a senior at Rollins College in Winter Park, Fla.

NCAPD 2016 Oral Health Service Award

Walter B. Jones, the U.S. Representative of North Carolina's Third Congressional District, was named the 2016 winner of the North Carolina Academy of Pediatric Dentistry's Oral Health Service Award (OHSA). Initiated in 2011, "the NC-OHSA was created to acknowledge an individual for outstanding achievements in Oral Health in NC, including those individuals who have a strong record of advocacy for children's oral health in the state".

Congressman Jones was nominated by NCAPD member Jasper Lewis, DDS 1971, MS 1973 of Greenville, and has served continuously in Congress since 1995. In his nomination Jasper noted that the congressman has worked with the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry Liaison (Dr. Heber Simmons) on multiple occasions to help promote bills that support children's oral health and additionally, has made many introductions to other congressman and senators who could be beneficial in supporting legislation helpful to children and pediatric dental education. He maintains a high profile among grass root dentists in NC and has maintained regular attendance at Greenville's Give Kids a Smile Day.

Previous OHSA winners include R. Gary Rozier (2015), Professor of Public Health Policy and Management in the Gillings School of Global Public Health. Theodore Oldenburg (2014), Professor Emeritus and Former Chair of the UNC-CH Department of Pediatric Dentistry, Rebecca King (2013), Former Chief of Oral Health Services at the NC Division of Public Health, Roy Lindahl (2012), Professor Emeritus and former Chair of the UNC-CH Department of Pediatric Dentistry, and Sharon Nicolson Harrell (2011), Dental Director of First-Health of the Carolinas Dental Care Centers. Congressman Jones is the first non-dentist to receive the OHSA. We were honored that Congressman Jones, a native of Farmville, was able to join us at the Annual NCAPD Reception at the Friday Center on October 8th to receive the OHSA in person. Thank you again Congressman Jones for all your support for the children we serve.

Department Research Activities

Our first year residents, **Anne Baker**, **Ivy Brisbin** and **Erin Tilton**, have been busy investigating potential research project ideas. **Anne** will be working with **Jessica Lee (2002)** and **Ray White** (Distinguished Professor of Oral and Maxillofacial surgery) to conduct a randomized clinical trial investigating the efficacy of buffered local anesthetics. Ivy will be working with **Tim Wright** to investigate families' perspectives regarding treatment with SDF. Erin will be working with **Martha Ann Keels (1990)** on an investigation of the interface between nutrition and ECC.

Our second year residents, **Gentry Byrd**, **Lauren Green** and **Molly Tesch** have been making significant progress in their projects and presented their research update in the department research seminar series in August. Gentry's work "Predictors of primary care physicians addressing prenatal oral health" was present at the AADR meeting last March and has been submitted for publication; Gentry's mentor is **Rocio Quinonez** (2000). Lauren has been making progress in her "cost analysis of conscious sedation versus general anesthesia in the OR versus general anesthesia in the dental office for pediatric dental patients." Lauren's mentor is **Jessica Lee** (2002). Molly is investigating "Oral disease experience among children with special healthcare needs" and her mentor is **Martha Ann Keels** (1990).

Our senior residents, **Jami Ballantine**, **Beau Meyer** and **Bhavna Pahel** have all made great progress in their research projects. Beau presented his MPH thesis project in November and received his degree in December. Of note, Beau was also awarded one of the three Sunstar/AAPD Post-graduate Research Fellowships, last May at the AAPD Annual session! Jami and Bhavna are both in the final stretch and have submitted their manuscripts for external peer review. Bhavna will be presenting her research findings at the upcoming IADR/AADR meeting in San Francisco, California, in March.

The Department of Pediatric Dentistry has a long history of conducting impactful research in a wide range of fields aimed to improve children's oral health. The department is currently involved in research in the areas of genetics, behavioral and health services research, education, and clinical studies and contributes significantly to the School of Dentistry's top national ranking in research funding by the NIDCR in FY 2015.
